PARENT TIPS

Raising Respectful Children:

When your youngster hears the word "respect," what does he/she think of? Explain that by being considerate of others' feelings, letting people know she appreciates them, or taking care of belongings, she is showing respect. Point out that there are different types of respect-for-ourselves, for others, for property, and for the environment. Then, try these ideas to help your child understand and practice all kinds of respect.

CHARACTER COUNTS

The month of September the ICES students will be focusing on bullying. We will talk about being a bully, being the bystander (or the witness to the bullying) and then figure out together what all three groups can do to make ICES a more bully free environment and can lead to absences from school. There are things parents can do to help. If your child is being bullied: If your child is the bully: talk with your child, talk with the teacher privately, apply reasonable consequences for their age, encourage them to change and help them build skills. If your child is the bystander: tell them to refuse to join in, encourage them to not turn into a bully by fighting or name-calling themselves.
